

MONTREAL, Dec. 3.—At the Montreal Stock Yards, west end market, offerings this morning amounted to 1300 cattle, 600 sheep and lambs, 2000 hogs and 300 calves. Owing to the continued limited supply of good cattle coming forward, a much stronger feeling has developed in the market since this day week and prices have advanced 25c to 50c per 100 pounds and in some cases more, and the prospects are that prices this day next week will be much higher for choice Christmas stock. There continues to be a steady demand from American buyers for common cattle notwithstanding the steady upward tendency of prices. A feature of the trade was the continued scarcity of choice steers. There were none on the market and there was considerable inguiry from both butchers and packers, and they would have paid \$3.25 to \$3.50 per cwt. for such stock. The demand for other grades of cattle was good.

Small Meats Firm.

There was no change in the condition of the market for small meats, but the feeling is very firm on account of the fact that the supplies coming forward are small, for which there is a good demand and an active trade is being done.

A weaker feeing developed in the market for hogs tolay, and prices, as compared with those paid last Wednesday, were 25c per 100 pounds lower, which was attributed to the increased offerings.
