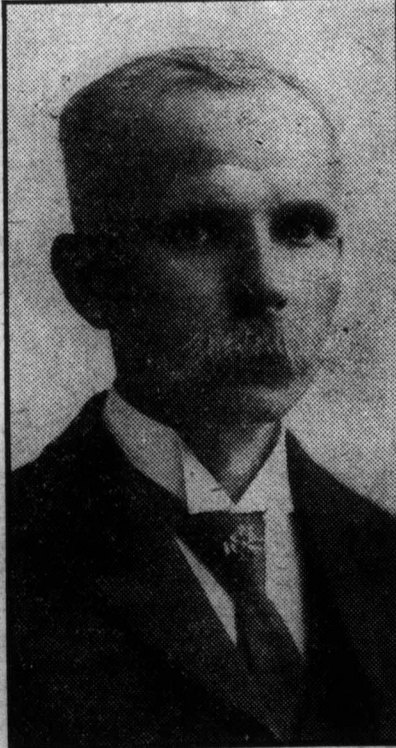

OVER 300,000 FISH WERE SHIPPED OUT FROM THE HATCHERY THIS YEAR

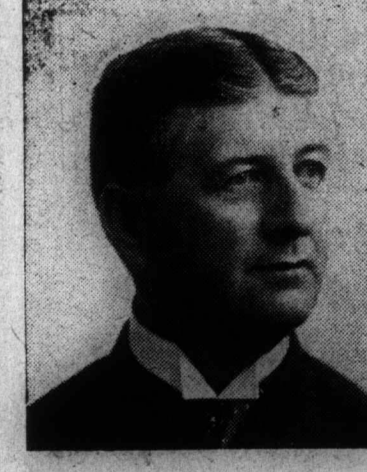
