Miss Mary Plummer is in charge of the work, and if a good response is made, the Canadian army will be well supplied for the winter about to ensue. Hand knitted materials are preferable and cholera belts are urgently requested, whole regiments being without them; handkerchiefs, colored, khaki preferred; sleeping caps, mufflers, wristlets, flannel shirts, underwear. All outside articles of clothing should be khaki or grey in color.
