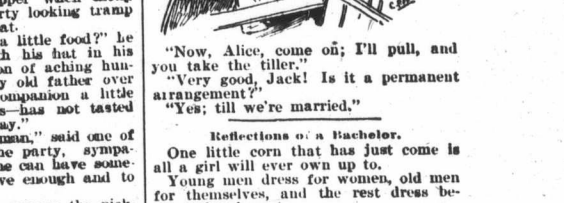
Chicago, Sept. 27.—The beginning of the sixth week of the Luybert trial today brought to the court room a larger crowd than usual.
