LIFE EARNINGS

Company Realizes Profits Amounting To The Sum Of \$63,000

ON SHAWINIGAN BONDS

Montreal, Oct. 19.—At the morning session of the Insurance Commission on Wednesday Mr. Macaulay defended the Sun Life Co's course in writing down securities on real estate before the losses had actually been realized. It was absolutely in accord with the method pursued by all banks and commercial corporations everywhere.

If you are going to write off \$10,000 from real estate, said Mr. Macaulay,

how can you do it except by changing the profit and loss account? There is no other way.

Mr. Langmulr asked whether such a plan might not be deceptive because it would show on its face that certain property had earned interest, whereas in fact it had not.

Mr. Macaulay would not agree to

Mr. Macaulay would not agree to this view.
Payments to shareholders were fixed by the directors under the company's charter, and could not be criticized. In the early days of the company they discriminated against the shareholders for the benefit of the policyholders. When the company's position was improved this injustice was corrected. For the last 12 years shareholders have been receiving 15 per cent.

Shawinigan Bonds.

Mr. Macaulay then entered into an explanation of the transactions between the Sun Life and the Shawinigan Water and Power Co. In 1903 the insurance company made a loan to the Shawinigan Co. of \$231,000 at six per cent. on the security of \$240,000 bonds and \$93,200 stock bonds. There had been two loans to the Shawinigan Co. on these bonds, a total of \$350,000 in each case. The Sun Life got large blocks of bonus stock as the consideration. The loan was due in November, 1903, but the Shawinigan Co. could not market the bonds in order to raise the loan. The Sun Life did not want to close the year with an overdraft, as would have been the case, and asked the Merchants' Bank to take over part of the loan. The bank took over \$200,000.

Mr. Macaulay said this was a gen-uine transfer, and read letters from the bank to prove it. In the following March the Sun Life paid the hank cash and took back the bonds. For extend-ing the loan in this way \$20,000 bonus stock was paid, of which the bank got \$4,000. He announced that his company had made \$43,000 out of this security without counting interest.

Mr. Shepley said that as the consideration of the company was higher than that of the bank the transfer was

than that of the bank the transfer was a dummy one.

Public Is Ignorant.

Asked why they did not want to show an overdraft at the end of the year, witness said it did not make any difference, except to a part of the public, which was ignorant and uninformed. He said the officers of the insurance Department would not have cared nor the shareholders of the Sun Life.

Mr. Macaulay stated, when asked by Mr. Shepley, that he had not a dollar of interest in the Shawingan Co., nor had the company, or the directors. There was, perhaps, one director who had a small interest. Later he said that there was not even one.

The bonus stock received from the Shawinigan Co. was entered in the books as of the value of \$4 and did not show in the Government returns until 1965, when it was sold as a matter of policy. The price was 19 3-4. Wituess said the stock is now worth 37.

The Commission adjourned until noon on Tuesday next.

They did not meet again until they came here for a re-union this week. Frederick, who went west and became a wealthy ranchman at Davis, South Dakota, determined to find his brothers and sister and succeeded after spending several thousand dollars.

Canadian Carnegie Hero.

Pittsburg, Oct. 19.—Sixteen more awards of funds or medals were made yesterday by the Carnegie hero fund commission. These awards include a bronze medal to Samuel M. Desherbining, 20 years of age, a jeweler of Langham, Province of Saskatchewan, Carneda, who rescued from drowning on Aug. 23, 1905, Alfred O. Burnham, a carpenter.

Very neat and serviceable rugs for use in the kitchen can be made from old trousers legs and heavy dress materials which are past redemption as wearing apparel. Wash the material and cut it in strips about two inches wide. Sew the strips together, making three lengths, which braid together tightly. Make the center of the rng of a heavy piece of material or a scrap of carpet, cut oval or round, and sew the braided strip round and round until the rug is the desired size.

Effective Table Square. A very effective table square was made at small cost from unbleached linen toweling twenty inches wide. Two lengths of linen were used and a line of heavy linen lace insertion was used to join the pieces. Narrow linen lace to match edged the square, and small round medallions of lace were let in at eight corners of the cloth.


A Test of Housekeeping.

Refurbished Bedstead.

One might term a bedstead recently evolved by an ingenious housewife a hybrid, yet it might be said in its favor that it combines the advantages of appearance of the mahogany four poster with the hygienic merits of the metal bed. How to Dry the Hair. Some children catch cold very easily after having their hair washed. Then rub the hair well with alcohol and wring it out as dry as possible. Next take two or three towels, divide the hair and wipe each strand separately.
