Local and Provincial.

The town report has been printed in a neat pamphlet, and has been distributed among the rate payers this week.

Mr. W. J. Cox, of Kings College, Windsor, conducted the services in St. John's church, of this town, very acceptably on Sunday last.

The Wolfville Curling Club have had a few practice games this week. A number have joined lately, and when their outdoor rink is completed, this Club will probably be the banner one of the province.

About 3 o'clock last Friday morning an alarm of fire was given, and the firemen quickly responding found that the fire had broken out in the residence of Dr. DeWitt. In a short time it was extinguished and with little damage.

Governor Daly and a number of representatives of the House of Assembly were in town Thursday, attending a meeting of the N. S. F. G. A. In the morning the Governor addressed the students of the School of Horticulture.
