to be more careful about their statements and not to mislead their readers; for although they may mislead them, we only have pity ane commis-cration for them, and for the writers for writing each impudent twaddle, and asserting things as facts which they do not know; or if they do know the facts, they are wilfully misleading the public.—The Foreign Times.

Hanlan on the Thames.

London, Sept. 29 .- Hanlan made his appearance on the Thames at eleven o'clock this foreucon. He has had a good night's rest and looked fresh and hearty. An enormous crowd had gathered to see him. George Hawthorn had his boat in good fix, and when the champion walked out of the Bull's Head and took his seat in her, he was loudly cheered. He had a long row, putting in excellent work and showing up quite afresh at the finish. On his way up the river he met Trickett, and the latter courteonsly welcomed the Canadian. This meeting of the two men was the signal for another round of cheering from the crowd on the bank. In the afternoon Hanlan turned out again and had another long pull, rowing in splendid form. Trickett and Lay-cock were also out twice during the day, but public attention was quite monopolized by Hanlan.

To Anglers and persons who are fond of sub-aqueous investigations the water-telescope, much used in some parts of Europe, is a very useful instrument. It is designed to obviate the difficulty which ripples on the surface of the water make for the eye which would pierce its depths. There are three forms of water-glass, namely, an ordinary bucket or barrel with the bottom knocked out; secondly, a piece of tin of a funnel shape, about three feet long and nine inches diameter at the broad (or bottom) end, and large enough at the top to accommo date the observer's eyes—into the broad end should be inserted a plate of strong glass and some lead to weigh it down; thirdly, the simplest way is to get a tin or zinc tube like a map SUBDUES Inflammation and Swellings. This should be about three and a half feet long and three inches in diameter. The bottom of this also should have glass and be weighed. When the water is clear this instrument will enable the observer to see from three to twenty fathoms on calm, bright days. Of course when the water is thick the glass is useless. Norwegian fishermen are constantly in the habit of using the instrument, and often discover by its aid shoals of fish which would otherwise escape them. In searching for wrecks bodies of drowned persons, or lost objects of any kind, the water telescope is invaluable. By it naturalists are en abled to observe the habits of fish and the growth of sub-aqueous vegetation. To water parties who pic-nic on rivers or lakes, it would offer a new enjoyment in revealing the sub-aqueous scenery.
