Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations. ANY person who is the sole head of a family or of any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and obtains a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. 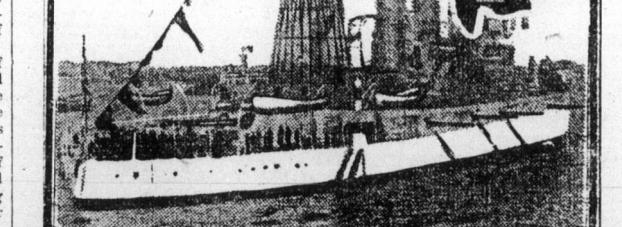

THIRTY-TWO SHIPS TO PLAY WAR. Thirty-two great, grim, ships will be seen for the first time. Bits of Information. To take out tea stains, when the usual boiling water fails, try whiskey. As for stains on mirrors or window glass, they may be removed by rubbing them with spirits of camphor, which leaves a bright polish besides. If the cellar is damp, so that articles left there become mouldy, place there an open box of unslaked lime. It absorbs the moisture in the air and keeps the cellar sweet and dry. It should be renewed several times during the year. Stains made by perspiration often stubbornly refuse to be removed. Try washing the waist with hot water and soap and laying on the grass in a hot sun. This should bleach the waist perfectly white. To restore ivory which has turned yellow, rub with turpentine.

PARIS—LONDON. Trip Will Soon be Attempted in a Huge Airship. British War Authorities Have Option on the Machine.

London, June 21.—An air voyage from Paris to London is about to be attempted by a hitherto unknown airship. The announcement is made by Arthur Philip Ducros, managing director of the Dunlop Pneumatic Tire Company, Ltd., and secretary of the parliamentary aerial defense committee. Writing to the Daily Mail, Mr. Ducros says the assumption of the Morning Post in regard to Great Britain's lethargy in the matter of airships is due to an imperfect understanding of the facts, both in regard to the government's building programme and the effort of parliamentary committee. Negotiations have been going on for some time, says Mr. Ducros, and following upon the recent trials abroad before British military and naval experts, it has been arranged to attempt, before the end of the present parliamentary session, to sail from Paris to London a modern airship of approved type, the largest and most powerful of its kind yet constructed. This ship, which is now approaching completion, will have a capacity of 22,500 cubic feet; will be propelled by two engines, two motors, each of 250 horsepower, and will carry 25 passengers, in addition to supplies and petrol sufficient to last 700 miles. The speed will be from 35 to 40 miles an hour, and the ship can ascend to a height of 6,000 feet.

GOES TO BENCH. But It Is the Carpenters' Bench With Hammer and Saw. (Special Despatch to the Times.) Montreal, Que., June 22.—Politics in the labor movement is responsible for the resignation of Joseph Ainey, business agent of the Carpenters and Joiners' Union, and labor official of twenty-three years' standing. At the last municipal election the Trades Council decided to support Vandaele against Al. Proulx. He went to meetings as instructed and supported Vandaele. The two Proulx resented this personally, and as they won, have been after Ainey's scalp ever since. They have it. Ainey goes to the bench, with hammer and saw.

JAPS AND CZAR'S STAMPS. Spoils of War Upon Which It Is Difficult to Realize. Among our good neighbors the Japanese nothing is wasted; out of all and everything they endeavor to extract benefit. The Japanese secured more than 1,500,000 rubles worth of Russian postage and revenue stamps abandoned by us in various post offices, branches thereof, and sundry other establishments. Now the enterprising Japanese are trying to dispose of these stamps among Russians.
