A pauphlett is in zirculation entitled "Memorial to the Dominion Government on the conditions of the finances of the Province of Nova Scotia," by the Hon. Simon H. Holms. Mr. Holms contends that the revenue of the Province, composed chiefly of the Dominion subsidy, is insufficient to meet the requirements of the public service. He points out that since 1870, although the Province received special grants of various Province received special grants of various kinds from Canada, the income has fallen far short of the expenditure, the over expenditure in that time amounting to \$390,000.

He estimates the needful expenditure of the Province at from \$545,000 to \$600,000 a Insolvent Act of 1875, Province at from \$545,000 to \$600,000 a year, and the reversue for the future under present arrangements at only \$450,000 to \$500,000.
