IRON ORE

Notice is given in the Royal Gazette that Hector McInnis, K. C. Halifax, a director of the Bank of Nova Scotia, has applied for mining rights covering an area of 66 square miles in the counties of Northumberland and Kent, N. B. The property surrounds the rich bog iron deposits in the vicinity of Rogersville. This body of bog ore was located several years ago and two blocks of five miles each were taken up. Later on, two large iron corporations had men on the ground looking over the situation and it is understood that the Dominion Iron and Steel Company, whose prospectors worked last summer on properties in the neighborhood, are really behind the application of Mr. McInnis.
