

Indeed, it is said that one of the greatest ambitions of

Commodfore Sueter before the war-was to fly across the Atlantic.

Before he became Inspecting Cap-tain of Aircraft in 1910 Commodore Sueter had gained a great reputation as an authority on submarines. In the early years of the present century he was one of our most promi ing submarine officers, and the book which he wrote on the problems of rganizing that service in the light of his actual experience as commande of a submarine is still regarded as a standard work on the subject.—Tit
