



The rocks of this region are great masses of red and yellow sandstone, through which a long-vanished river has cut the deep gash that now is the canyon. The thin layers of the sandstone, some of which can be seen in the rock surrounding the arched opening in the foreground, frequently contain ripple-marks made by the wind on the surface of desert sanddunes millions of years ago, when these

rocks were being formed. In other places appear tiny depressions made by the raindrops of desert showers that fell in that long distant
