SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

WEST LAND REGULATIONS

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section (160 acres more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district, Entry by proof and before the proof of the same and any be made at any agency or Sub-Agency for the district, and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead or a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, monther, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead price at the control of the same in the date of homestead entry (including the dime required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered sections south of township 45, east of Calgary and Edmonton railway and the west line of range 28, and west of the third meridian and the Sault railway line. Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.
