New regulations appear with regard to cadet corps. Each corps in possession of an Esdale target will get a free annual issue of a roll of target and two thousand paper targets; a bond for \$250 must be given. Arrange-ments must be made for the safekeeping of the machine.

New regulations regarding the medical services appear in militia general orders. It now is provided that: All future appointments to the medical service of the active militia shall be made to the Canadian Army Medical Corps.

Officers of the C. A. M. C. will be detailed for duty with regiments and other units having a medical officer on the establishment.

Officers so detailed will revert to the regimental list C. A. M. C., after five years, for other duty in connecofficer may be detailed for another term of five years to a regiment.

No officer above the rank of major of the C. A. M. C. shall be detailed to regimental medical charge. Officers of the present regimental medical service will remain with their


