Knapp, of the interstate commerce commission, as the representative of the United States to confer with

result is not satisfactory.

The difficulties practically preclude any inquiry by existing tribunals into the reasonableness of combination through rates as applied to international traffic. No power exists at present that can compel carriers interested in this International transportation to establish what may officially be regarded as reasonable through joint rates and apportion those rates among the participating carrriers in the event of a disagreement. The result is that the international traffic must move on a combination of rates local to the United States and Can-
