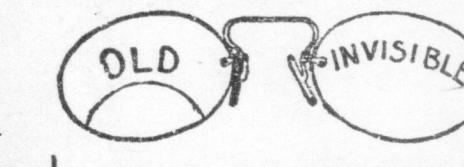

Underwriters' Banquet.

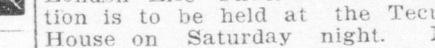

WORK COMMENCED ON CATHOLIC CHURCH

It is Hoped to Have It Ready by Christmas.

Work has been begun on the new St. Michael's Roman Catholic Church on the corner of Cheapside and Maitland streets, and it is hoped to have it completed by Christmas.

It is understood a separate school will also be started close to the church within a few days, and this will be used in place of St. Nicholas' school, which will be closed. The new structure will be of brick and stone, will comprise four rooms, and will be a modern school in all respects.

The church when completed will cost close to \$40,000.

REMEMBER THE PLACE**GRAND COUNCIL OF THE ROYAL ARCANUM****Annual Reunion of the Organization Is Being Held at Hamilton.**

Hamilton, April 10.—The nineteenth re-union of the Royal Arcanum grand council of Ontario opened in the assembly hall of the Conservatory of Music this morning, with a good attendance of delegates. John Cottam, London, grand regent for Ontario, presided, and the other officers present were: Lyman Lee, Hamilton, grand vice-regent; E. C. Sanders, St. Thomas, grand orator; R. K. Cowan, London, grand secretary; J. W. Hickson, Toronto, grand treasurer; R. McLellan, Toronto, grand chaplain; C. A. Mitchell, London, grand guide; J. Dearness, Hamilton, grand warden; James Smith, Hamilton; J. E. Twigg, Kingston, and R. A. Willescroft, Owen Sound, trustees. Dr. George Elliott, Toronto, provincial medical examiner;

past grand regents, W. J. Code, Ottawa; J. B. McKillop, London; Major H. J. Spelgrave, Toronto.

Following the presentation and introduction of the new representatives present, Robert Van Sandt, of Chicago, past supreme regent of the order, was introduced by Bros. McKillop and Cole, and grand honors were extended to him.

Committee Reports.

The reports of the various officers were then presented to the distribution committee, which at this afternoon's session considered them and distributed them to the various committees for consideration before their final adoption by the grand council.

Just before the noon adjournment the report of the executive committee was presented and the following recommendations were adopted:

That the supreme representatives be instructed to request the supreme council to continue the services of Bro. McMullan as organizer in this jurisdiction.

That your supreme representatives be instructed to urge a change in the laws of the order whereby the minimum age for admission be reduced to 18 years.

That your supreme representatives be further instructed to support the movement in the supreme council for the elimination of the table of regular rates as now existing and the retention of the table of rates known as Option A.

That your supreme representatives be also requested to urge the insertion in the laws of the order of a provision whereby, a refund may be made to members who have overpaid on assessments through mistake in age, such refund to be made either by payment in cash or by a rebate in future assessments.

That the advisability of increasing the number of organizers be brought to the attention of the supreme council.

At 4 o'clock this afternoon the delegates were taken by special car on a tour of inspection of the city and also through the factory of the Canadian Westinghouse Company.

This evening a class initiation and a smoker are being held for the entertainment of the delegates.

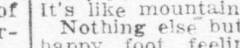
