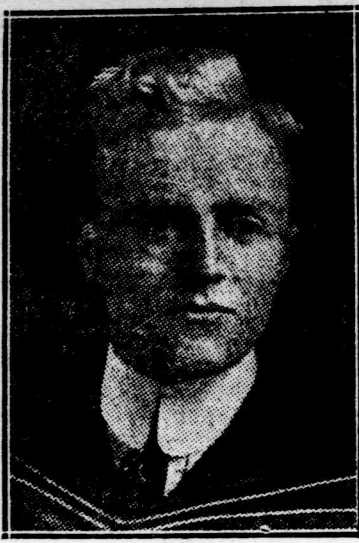

PAPER STRIKE IS NOW ENDURANCE TEST

ALBANY, N. Y., May 12.—Approximately 40,000 men in all branches of the paper-making industry are now on strike in the United States, Canada and Newfoundland. It is estimated by Jeremiah T. Carey, president of the International Brotherhood of Paper Makers, one of the organizations which has called its membership from the plants to enforce a 10 per cent wage increase demand.

President Carey said today that no further conferences between representatives of the unions and of the employers were in immediate prospect. "It looks as though we had settled down to a test of endurance," he added.

WANT MOUNTIES WITHDRAWN AS SUPERVISORS

Delegations Ask That Track Regulations Regarding Percentages Be Changed.

ARE WELL REPRESENTED

Both Ontario and Quebec Are Taking Matter Up At Ottawa.

OTTAWA, May 12.—The Journal this morning carries the following on its sport page:

"Opposition is developing against the Royal Canadian Mounted Police having supervision at Canadian race tracks. This assumed tangible shape yesterday, when a delegation from Western Ontario tracks and delegates representing Quebec tracks placed before the Government a request that the mounties be withdrawn as supervisors of the pari-mutuel machines, and their power, recently conferred of checking up and looking after the interests of the Government in handling the 'take' be removed. This request was incidental to a request that the Government change the existing law governing the percentage allotted to tracks. Under the new legislation the Canadian tracks, it is understood, will be strangled out of existence, when the provincial taxes are taken into consideration.

Well Represented. "Dalton McCarthy, R.C., representing the Canadian Racing Association; George Hendrie of the Windsor track, and one of the powers of Ontario racing; H. J. McIntyre, vice-president of the Hamilton Jockey Club, and, it is understood, Gen. McWaters, former minister of militia, comprised the delegation.

"The opposition of the Quebec tracks was voiced in particular to the employment of the mounties. They have forwarded their protest to Premier Meighen. Quebec race officials state that the presence of the mounties, while not objectionable, is unpopular in Quebec.

"One authority, not from Ottawa, who is in close touch with racing, states that the legislation authorizing the mounties to look after the locking of machines, is not looked on with disfavor by the tracks, but they do not like the presence of the mounted police on their tracks, as it gives an effect of 'extraordinary police supervision.' At present private detective agencies police all the tracks in Ontario and Quebec.

Foremost Objection. "The foremost objection is that the mounties have no experience in checking up and tabulating pari-mutuel returns. It is a class of work in which skilled mathematicians might find themselves at sea. There is no one in the mounted police force capable of doing this work. Only ten days intervene till racing starts, and it is obviously impossible that men could be schooled in that time. It is understood that the Government has in mind securing the services of instructors to give the mounties the essential preparation. Experience of the employment of inexperienced supervisors will result in retarding the calculation work between races, and result in general disorganization."

FOREST FIRES ARE SPREADING IN QUEBEC

QUEBEC, May 12.—(By Canadian Press).—The department of lands and forests was advised today that forest fires had broken out at Lake Chat and Lac a Beauce, in the St. Maurice region, and were extending. Reports from other sections are to the effect that the situation is well under control, and that the work carried out by the forest rangers has been successful up to now. Dryness is still a constant danger.

REMANDED FOR ASSAULT. GALT, May 12.—Because of the serious condition of the complainant's hand, Charles Seitz, charged with assault causing actual bodily harm, was again remanded today for a further eight days.

UNCERTAINTY OVER PENDING LEGISLATION ALARMS INVESTORS

Adds To Difficulties of Obtaining Funds For Mortgages.

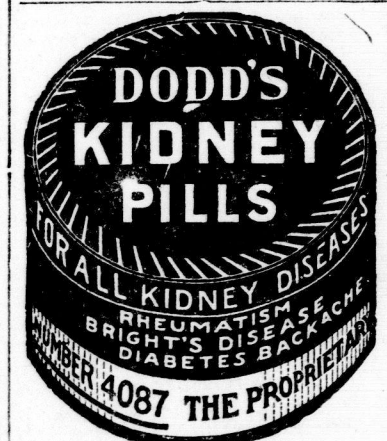
WINNIPEG, May 12.—At the opening session of a two-day convention of the Canada Mortgage Loan Association today, a special committee was appointed to inquire into the whole matter pertaining to the lien priority given to seed grain advances, the gathering agreement with the statement of John Appleton, Toronto, secretary of the Dominion Association, that this was a "pernicious and quite unjustifiable practice."

Sharp criticism of the moratorium and of defaulting municipalities also featured the session which, in the absence of the president, A. E. Holt, Montreal, was presided over by W. E. Long, Toronto.

Several Defaults. In the report of the municipal finances committee, reference was made to default in payments to cities and towns in Alberta and Saskatchewan. Twelve municipalities, principally in Alberta

and Saskatchewan, had a funded debt of \$4,513,283, on which arrears amounted to \$263,881, or 6 per cent. Seven in default at present had a funded debt of \$3,485,300, of which \$377,697, or 10.8 per cent, was overdue. The situation in Saskatchewan was described as the cause of anxiety to holders of all classes of securities issued by the province and its municipal institutions.

In Alberta, Manitoba and British Columbia, active steps had been taken to obviate loss to debenture holders in future. In practically all cases of default it had been found that public debentures on improvements and public works had been excessive and operation and maintenance had been expensive.
