House of Commons.

The House of Commons was crowded this evening. Mr. Gladstone, replying to a question by Sir Michael Hicks-Beach (Conservative), said that the Government considered it to be its duty after the second reading of the Home Rule Bill not to ask the House to go into committee on the measure, but to adopt one of the methods which the (Gladstone) described at the Liberal meeting yesterday. The Government, he said, was inclined to allow the Bill to lapse for the present session, and to advise the Queen to cause an early reassemoling of Parliament, at which the Home Rule Bill would be reintroduced. He was unable at that moment to speak more positive.

Sir Michael Hicks-Beach, in view of the unsatisfactory statement of the Government, moved an adjournment. He was graeted with cheers by the Giposition, all the Conservatives rising to support the motion. The speaker, continuing, said that the Government prior to the introduction of the Bill, had dwelt upon the necessity of restoring social order in irreland, and had said that the Government was of one mind, and had an intelligible plan. Was the plan, he asked found so unfeasible that nobody would vote for it? If it was found good and feasible, why did the Government now propose to withdraw or postpone the Bill: The Bill simply smounted to a Continuance-in-Office Bill. Cheers.)

Mr. Gladstone, upon rising to reply, was loudly cheered. He repudiated the sordid motives which Sir Michael Hicks-Beach had imputed to the Government, aithough, he said, the general confidence of his countrysm in in the Government rendered such repudiation unnecessary. The Subsidy of \$256,000 Voted by the House.

Special to the FREE PRESS. TITLED CANADIANS. Ottawa, Ont., May 28—A dispatch resceived by cable to-day conveys the information that Her Majesty has been pleased to bestow the title of K. C. M. G. on Hon. Donald A. Smith, and the title of Knight Baronet on Chief Justice Meredith, of Quebec.

Ottawa, May 28—The supplementary estimates for the fiscal year ending 30th June, 1887, were laid on the table to-day. The appropriations amount in all to \$2,005,849, of which \$170,000 is chargeable to capital; \$1,095,849 to income. Among the principal items are:—To meet the expenses of the Frauchise Act, \$100,000; to provide police vessels for fisheris, \$50,000; experimental farms, \$30,000; and the following public works:—London Custom House, \$2,400; London Instantry School, \$30,000; Windsor Post Office, \$2,960; B.rin Post Office, \$400; N W. Mounted Police Barracks, \$75,000; Kincardine Harbor, \$3,000; Saugeen River pier, \$7,000; Owen Sound Harbor, \$10,000; Port Elgin Habor, \$2,500; Collingwood Harbor, \$5,000.
