MAKING SURVEY TO GLO. MINES

**Large Staff of Engineers at Work at
Bartibogue Station Running
Lines to Mines.
LEVEL COUNTRY.**

An engineering staff has been sent to Bartibogue to run lines for the proposed railway to the Gloucester mines, and already good progress has been made.

The route as gone over, presents a very favorable ground for the proposed line. It is almost level, no large river to cross, and the mines are only about thirteen miles from Bartibogue station.

The general impression now is that Newcastle will be made the head-quarters for the Drummond Mines Company. A fine site at what is known as Mill Cove, with deep water a few feet from shore is procurable, little wharf building necessary, high bank with solid freestone foundation, and only a short distance from the C. E. track.

S. W. Miller, Mayor of Newcastle, is leaving no stone unturned to have the company locate here and things look favorable to that town.

BRITISH BLUEJACKETS WERE
LANDED AT BUSHIRE, PERSIA

Russia Expected to Take Similar Action at Other Points

LONDON, April 12.—The situation in Persia is gradually developing in the direction of an Anglo-Russian intervention. British bluejackets were landed from the cruiser Fox at Bushire on Saturday, after a British resident had issued a proclamation setting forth the necessity of this action because of the inability of the local authorities to protect foreigners. It is understood that the landing of bluejackets was sanctioned beforehand by Russia and it is expected that the latter government will be obliged to take similar measures to protect foreigners at Tauris and Bushir.
