The Tribune made special reference to Chatham. Mr. W. B. Snowball Chairman of the School Board there, informed me today that Chatham had not abandoned the work, but that enrollment for the winter was going forward.

It is stated that a \$500. town grant is not sufficient. Reference is made to Woodstock. There a Day Vocational School is maintained which is very different and much more expensive than evening classes. A large building is devoted solely to the work, and a permanent staff employed.

For the present school year, Woodstock poys for this service \$2500. and not \$3000. as stated. In addition the County of Carleton contributes \$2500. making a total budget, exclusive of government grants, of \$5000. This provides a day and evening service, open to all the people of the county over 14 years of age. The day departments teach, agriculture, home economics, mechanics, and commercial subjects. In the evenings these and other subjects are offered.

The "Tribune" is quite right when it points out that Vocational Tra ning will cost just as much in Campbellton as in Woodstock. Woodstock's night school progress last year, however, cost less than \$5000., and it is unfair to confuse this with the day school work there carried on.

An efficient evening school program can be carried on in Campbellton on a town grant of \$500. exclusive of the cost of heating, lighting and rent. Nova Scotia's experience proves this conclusively. That province has been at work long enough to develop effective programs in this connection. In 1917 the town of Amherst ran eleven evening classes, aecomodating 156 students at a total cost of \$1887.54

In 1917 the town of Amherst ran eleven evening classes, ascomodating 156 students at a total cost of \$1887.54 (this includes the cost of much expensive electrical equipment.) Under Cambellton's conditions only \$758.08 would have been a tax on the town. In the same year, Sydney operated 14 classes and had 256 in attendance at a total cost of \$1009.70. With us, this would mean a town levy of \$426.36 In 1917 the Yarmouth evening achools had an attendance of 71, and cost in all \$612. This in New Brunswick would mean a local assessment of only \$204.00. The Nova Scotia classes run for 6 months of the year, and employ only practical experts as teachers. In view of this, Campbellton can surely make a fair beginning with evening vocational classes on \$500. A complete Vocational training will, of gourse, cost much more.

The Tribune asserts that "Vocational Training Schools are not required in Campbellton." Can it be that there are no boys and girls 14 to 18 years of age who deserve increased opportunity to prepare for efficiency and good citizenship, and no adult workers to whom further knowe dge of
