

FAIR MISS FORTESCUE.

HER BEACH OF PROMISE SUIT AGAINST LORD GARMOYLE.

The trial commenced at London yesterday at 10 o'clock.

Defendant still professes love.

LONDON, Nov. 20.—The suit for breach of promise brought by Miss Fortescue, actress, against Lord Garmoye began to-day.

Chas. Russell, for the plaintiff, said defendant admitted the promise to marry.

plaintiff and breaking of the promise without justifiable cause.

Miss Fortescue was educated as a lady, but in consequence of her father's failure in business she was educated as a milliner.

She supported her mother and sister. Her salary at the Savoy theatre was three guineas a week at first and later two.

She made the acquaintance of Lord Garmoye in society late in 1882.

The acquaintance ripened rapidly into mutual regard and intimacy.

In July 1883, Garmoye made a proposal of marriage. Miss Fortescue accepted the proposal and at once informed her mother.

She expressed to a cordial but guarded approval of his suit, and wrote Miss Fortescue that his only desire in the world was for her happiness.

She replied, assuring him her only wish was to make Garmoye happy.

A little later this Garmoye saw his betrothed and the latter, while saying he would not himself have made such a choice, gave his consent to the union, July 20, 1883.

The engagement was announced, and Miss Fortescue became the recipient of kindly letters from other members of Garmoye's family.

It is estimated over 300 died in Virginia. People are alarmed at the mysterious character of the disease.
