The new grand stand, some new stables, the enlargement of the carriage building, the enlargement of the carriage building, the construction of the new half-mile track and horse ring will be completed by Sept, 5, but it is probable the balance of the work will not be commenced until the fall.

The grading of the half-mile track was commenced on Monday morning, the contractor being Mr. John Riley of St. Catharines. Inside the outer track will be a second track for the exhibition of harness and saddle horses when the outer track is being used for speeding purposes.
