In the "Legal Department" of the Mail and Empire of last Saturday, the following questions, which had been sent from Forest, and the accompanying answers appeared :--questions, which had been sent from Forest, and the accompanying answers appeared :---Qu.--Has a Town Council power to pass a by-law compelling ratepayers to cut the weeds on the streets opposite their lots, and to appoint an inspector to notify the rate payers when such weeds be cut ? (2) If the ratepayers have been notified, and neglect to cut the weeds can the inspect-or have them cut and charge the cost to ratemayers?

(3) The street at the back of my lot has never been open for public travel, and it has been used as a dumping ground for rubbich by order of the Town Council. Can I be compelled to cut the weeds on this street? Ars.—Section 547 of the Consolidated Municipal Act of 1903 says: "Municipali-ties may pass by laws for the purpose of pre-venting the growth of Canada this les and other weeds detrimental to husbandry, and for compelling the destruction thereof."
(2) If the by-law provides that the rate-payers should be notified to destroy the weeds, and if they neglect to do so within a certain limited time after notice, the in-spector shall then cut down the weeds and the expense or cost thereof shall be charged to the ratepayers. I think the by-law would be legal and within the power of the Council and that the ratepayers can be com-pelled to pay the charge.

(3) As the street in the rear of your (3) As the street in the rear of your premises was never opened fand is not a pub-lic street you are not obliged to destroy the weeds growing upon it, and cannot be com-pelled to do so. A by-law must be "reason-able"; if it imposes an unreasonable obligasion upon any rate payer, he has a legal right to refuse to obey, and can apply to the court for an injunction to retain the corporation for enforcing it against him.

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Must Sell Their Land.

London, Sept. 12 .- The Times Welling-London, Sept. 12.—The Times Welling-ton correspondent says that the government land proposals, the most drastic in the bistory of the colonial legislation, are creat ing fintense interest in New Zealand, es-pecially the clanses compelling owners to sell within a decade the excess of land held beyond \$250_0.00 unimproved value, and the provisions preventing the present owners of 1000 acres of first-class land or those of 5000 acres of accond-class land ad. those of 5000 acres of second class land, ad-ding to their cstates either by freeholds or leaseholds.

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
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
