We publish below showing the results achieved by the Catholic Separate Schools at the last annual examinations. Catholics are confident that their schools are doing a good work in Ontario and these statistics must strengthen that confidence.

In connection with the number of candidates writing, it should be understood that about one-third of the Separate Schools are found in French or German districts, where usually the children begin school life without knowledge of English, and remain too short a time to permit their preparation for such examinations. Then in some subjects the text-books are not always the same as those used in the Public Schools, which latter is the series upon which the examination questions are based. When these drawbacks are considered it speaks for the thoroughness of the teaching in Separate Schools to find that 75 per cent. of their candidates for this examination passed successfully, without any undue favors from its various local boards of examiners. As to Toronto, it should be explained that having a system of Catholic high classes doing the work of High Schools to the junior leaving inclusive, it has not heretofore sent candidates to the entrance examination. This year, with but little notice, some of the senior fourth class girls of one school tried the examination, with the result noted above.

LATEST MARKETS.

TORONTO, Oct. 20.—On the curb in Chicago at the opening to day December wheat was quoted at 82 1/2; at the close December wheat was quoted at 81 1/2 asked; puts on December wheat 80 1/2, calls 81 1/2; puts on December corn 28 1/2, calls 28 1/2; puts on May corn 29 1/2.

Wheat—There was rather more offering to-day and the market was firm, with sales of red and white at 81 1/2 middle freight and at 80 1/2 north and west; spring wheat offered at 75 on the Midland and good middle freight at 72 1/2. Manitoba wheat was rather easier; 40,000 bushel lot of No. 1 hard was offered about Fort William, delivery this month at 81 1/2, with 10c bid.

Flour—Is in fair demand and the market is steady to firm. Bids to day would have netted in some cases a little better than 84 for extra straight roller wheat.

Barley—Steady at 24 to 25 for feed and 32 for 20 outside.

Rye—Easier and sold at 41 1/2 middle freight.

Corn—Steady at 23 to 30 for yellow and 22 to 25 for white.

Butter—The receipts to-day were small, the demand is active and the market is firm at 16 1/2 to 16 for the best pails and tubs and 10 to 12 for low grade and medium.

Eggs—The demand is good and the market is firm, with moderate supplies, at 10c for strictly fresh graded.

Poultry—The market is steady. Cars on the track here are quoted at 45 to 50c. Poultry out of store at 50c.

Butter—The receipts to-day were small, there was a better demand and the market was steady at 30 to 35c for chickens, 40c to 45c for ducks, 50c for geese and 30c to 10c for turkeys.

Baled Hay—Is dull and unchanged. Cuts on the track here are quoted at \$8 to \$8 50.

Dressed Hogs—The market is dull but steady. Cars on the track here are quoted at \$5.

The receipts of grain on the street market to-day were smaller; prices of good wheat, rye and barley were firmer. Other grains were steady.

Wheat—Steady; 1,000 bushels selling at 82 1/2 to 83 for red and white, and 78 to 78 1/2 for white and barley were firmer.

Barley—Firm; 2,000 bushels selling at 28 to 30c.

Rye—Firm; two loads selling at 44 to 45c.

Hay—Steady; 600 bushels selling at 24 to 25c.

Straw—Firm; four loads selling at 45 to 46c.

Straw—Steady; 20 loads of hay selling at 36 to 40; one load of straw was received, prices quoted were \$8 to \$8 50.

Dressed Hogs—There were none offered; prices are nominal at \$6 to \$6 25.
