matter of getting up the diploma be referred back again to the Committee.—Carried.

It was agreed that the candidates who had passed the present examination, and were in immediate want of their certificates, might be supplied with the old style; and those who preferred to wait could have the new ones when ready for distribution.

Mr. Yeomans gave notice of motion, That at next meeting of this Council he will bring forward an amendment to By-Law No. 3,

advancing the salary of our Registrar to \$500 per year.
