

On many important international issues, EC member states act together as a block after they have achieved internal agreement on a common position. The requirements for this are set out in the Single European Act (SEA) of 1987. The SEA provides that the EC member states shall act in a common position on international issues, and that the EC shall be represented by the President of the Commission and the High Representative of the Community in external relations.
