

that all the bills have been passed by the Senate and the House and that the President has signed them.

By order of the Senate and subject to the approval of the President, the following bills are hereby approved and shall have the force and effect of laws.

80. The Senate hereby approves the report of the Committee on the Judiciary, which report is as follows:

80. A report committee shall not sit during a recess of the Senate.

Proposed Amendments
November 22, 1917

80A. All questions before select committees shall be decided by majority vote in-cluding the vote of the Chairman and whenever the vote is equal the Chairman shall be deemed to be in the negative.

80B. A report of any select committee shall contain the positions taken by the majority and shall not reflect adversely on individual members.

80C. A motion made in any select committee shall not require a second.

80D. A select committee may, at any time during its existence, and without the necessity of a report, hold public hearings and receive evidence and report thereon to the Senate.

Proposed Amendments

80E. The Senate hereby approves the report of the Committee on the Judiciary, which report is as follows:

81. Upon the presentation of a report on the part of the Senate, the House shall be notified and the President shall be notified.

The report of the Senate shall be referred to the House upon its receipt and the President shall be notified.

81. A report from a select committee shall be reported by the Chairman of the Committee to the Senate.

82. When a report is presented to the Senate it shall be referred to the appropriate committee.

83. When the report of the Senate is received by the House, the House shall be notified.
