Mr. Beatty thereupon moved that Bill C-16 an Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the Government of Canada for the financial year ending March 31, 1985, be read the first time and be printed.

Motion agreed to and Bill read the first time.

Mr. Beatty thereupon moved that Bill C-16, an Act for granting for Her Majesty certain sums of money for the Government of Canada for the financial year ending March 31, 1985, be read the second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole.

Motion agreed to, Bill read the second time and the House went into committee thereon, Mr. Paproski in the chair.

Mr. Gray (Windsor West): It is usual at this point for the responsible Minister to give assurances that the Bill is in the usual form. Can either the Government House Leader (Mr.

Hnatyshyn) or the Acting President of the Treasury Board give the committee these assurances? In fact, where is the Bill?

Mr. Beatty: Mr. Chairman, I guess I am as responsible a Minister as any. I can give the Hon. Member that assurance.

The Deputy Chairman: It is my understanding that the Bill was distributed this morning.

Clauses 2 to 6 inclusive agreed to.

Schedule agreed to.

Clause 1 agreed to.

Preamble agreed to.

Bill reported, read the third time and passed.
