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those not from Dalhousie failed and were denied their provincial licenses.

The Medical Ecard refused to refund any part whatsoever of the one hundred dollars it demanded and received from each of the outside men in order to take the examination.

The only portion of the examination in which any man failed was clinical surgery. This included the instruments in use at the Victoria General Hospital (in connection with Dalhousie) and specimens of the Dalhousie Fathological Museum.

There has recently been a discussion in the newspapers of Nova Scotia in regard to the results of the examination in question. A Dalbousie medical professor has declared in the press that the instruments of the Victoria General Hospital are as good as any in America, and if the MoGill and the Harverd men could not recognize them when they saw them, then they themselves were to blame.

The President of Dalhcusie - Dr. A. S. MacKenzie - has recently also declared himself explicitly to the effect that the examination was conducted with fairness to all.
