I am well aware that the invitation to Sir Arthur was sent to him as former Commander of the Canadian Corps in France. However, McGill University also does homage to the memory of the great French Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Forces, and it is with a sense of this, Sir, that I address these lines to you. I have made some enquiries in the University and I find that several former Canadian officers connected with McGill University are attending to-morrow's deremony.
