District of Montreal. GENERAL SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, Monday, April 30, 1810.

Additional Regulation of Police, Respecting the Markets in the City of Montreal.

THE Justices having observed, for some time past, that a great number of persons have been in the habit of bringing provisions and divers other articles to the Markets in this City on Wednesdays, and thinking that it would tend to the public benefit if another market day were established, besides the three days in each week fixed by the Regulations of Police. It is, therefore, ordered that Wednesday in each week shall, in future, be considered as a public market day, and that all persons who may bring articles to either of the Markets of this City, on the said day, shall be subject to the existing regulations respecting the said Markets.
