AUSTRIAN LOSSES NEARLY MILLION

Petrograd Makes Estimate—Ten Miles of German Trenches Taken.

Canadian Press Despatch. PETROGRAD, Russia, Nov. 30, via London.—On the basis of reports received from Petrograd from Hungary it is stated here today that the Austro-Hungarian casualties to date amount to 15,000 officers and 500,000 men.

Our aeroplanes have been especially active in the last two days, having dropped 120 bombs.

The account refers to several instances in which German attacks were repulsed, particularly on Nov. 22, in the south of the River Lys. There, it is stated, the Germans did considerable execution at close quarters.

They even penetrated some of the German trenches, where they wielded their peculiar curved swords with great effect.

Cried "Nein, Nein." The report again refers to the efficiency of German discipline. It says that the British soldier could hear the command "Vorwaerts" coming from the woods. It was followed immediately by a rush of Germans.

One, twice and thrice this was done. Each time the Germans were moved down. Then the order was given again. This time, however, there were loud exclamations of "Nein, nein," and an advance was made.

Cooks Did Nobly. Dealing with the onslaught of the Prussian Guard the report says that unless a firing line of some kind could be established, the British officers' messengers, cooks, and details of various descriptions, these men stood firm and kept up a steady fire. They checked off the assault at the most critical moment, thus enabling other troops to come up to repel more completely.

Other incidents taken up in the report are the movement of British cavalry by motor cars, thus adding one more novelty to the campaign which the cavalry has played during the war.

Blowing up of a farmhouse containing German snipers, the heating of trenches with heated stones, and the transport service, whose work in supplying food is commended.

The extent of the Russian advance Lakes and the River Angerapp is officially stated to be one day's march.

Fields of France Are Cemeteries. Small Mounds Mark Spot Where French and Germans Fell. Villages Destroyed. Heaps of Bricks Remain—Sights Are Full of Paths. Canadian Press Despatch. VITRY-LE-FRANCOIS, Nov. 30.—Black ruins which have just ceased smouldering, houses whose interiors have been demolished by German shells, leaving only the skeletons of their structure standing, others with sides blown out, still others where only a chimneystack remains intact are common sights in this portion of the track of the armies fighting a short distance to the north. Amid the desolation, in half-shattered shacks, sit women and children and old men, uttering scarcely a word except about their husbands and fathers and sons away with the army, and from which news is rare if it comes at all. Lack of laborers makes it almost impossible for the villagers to start any repairs. Trade is at a standstill and articles of domestic necessity are difficult to obtain owing to the dislocation of transport.
