From team, where I interviewed Mr. Knobel, Minister too to Netherlands, who assured me that he would do within a his power to induce the Chinese governate to make an investigation, and added that Sir Color Maed hald, the British Minister, was acting or rly with him in the matter. I would fain have remained a China to await the result, but my health was undermited, friends were pressing me to return to A erica, and Mr. Knobel assured me that my presence was in processary, that the government would do exercition that ould be done. Under date of May 2, 1900, Mr. Knobel received a report from the Tsing-li Yam a of which the following is a translation:

With a gard to Mr. Rijnha is case, our vamen has repeatedly corresponded with the Governor of Szechnen, the Imperial Resident in Tibet, and the Imperial Agent at Sining, who were all instructed to investigate add report upon the matter. We wrote you already to this effect on March 8th, last. We since received, on April 21st, a dispatch from the Imperial Agent at Sining, reading:

About this matter, telegrams have come to hand from the Tsung-li Yamen and the Governor of Szechuen instructing me to hold an investigation. The necessary orders have been given. According to information received from the English missionary Lo Tcheng (Langhton), living at Sining in the Fu yin tan, the Dutch missionary "Lan" is the same as Mr. Rijnhart. He is said to have disappeared white traveling.
