SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH.

WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

And person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba. Saskatchewan or Aberta. The applicant must appear in person et the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, morner, con, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his nemestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, olely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption aix months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (inolating the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead righ, and can of board a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per acre.
