On Saturday next the Independent Labor Party of Greater Toronto is to meet in convention. The old line politicians are still in the jeering stage about the Labor political movement.

RIGHT TO MINE COAL OF RIVAL COMPANY. Permission Given by Controller to Nova Scotia Company to Enter Area of Dominion.

Ottawa, Nov. 5.—After hearing arguments of counsel for the Dominion Coal Company and the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company, C. A. Macgregor, Dominion fuel controller, this afternoon announced that he would recommend to the government that the latter company be granted the right to take out coal from the holdings of the Dominion Coal Company under Sydney harbor.


