COMBINE AGAINST SOCIALISTS. All German Political Parties Except Radicals Unite. Berlin, Jan. 29.—All the political parties except the Extreme Radicals are combining against the Socialists in the Reichstag which are to take place in the electoral districts where none of the candidates for the reichstag succeeded in obtaining a majority.

Seven Thousand Strike. Baku, Transcaucasia, Jan. 29.—Seven thousand employes of four naphtha works have struck to-day. Their demands included a bonus for 1906, varying from 20 to 80 per cent. of their wages for the year. A general strike is being planned.
