VICTORIA NURSES RECEIVE DIPLOMAS

No Need of Conscription for Women, Declares Speaker.

TWENTY-SEVEN GRADUATE

Type of Girls for Great Work.

Arrangements had been made to hold the exercises on the lawn at the Normal School, and for this purpose a platform had been erected, but owing to the unfavorable weather it was decided at the last moment to hold them indoors. Second Only To One.

"But there haven't been 6,000 men sick of typhoid in the whole British army in the present war." declared Dr. McCallum. "Lord Northcliffe, one of the severe critics of the administration, had stated that "only one arm of the British service was flawless, and that was the army medical service."
