Toronto horses were much in evidence. Mrs. Livingston, of Pontiac stock farm, had 22 entries in thoroughbred mares and foals of 1909. Amelitus Jarvis, Hon. Clifford Sifton, Sir Henry Pellatt, Crowe and Murray, David Dick (Cobourg), all had entries in the hunters and jumpers up to 150 lbs.

"Confidence" and "Ironside" (Crowe & Murray), won first and second. In the cob class over 141, Crowe & Murray were 1st and Mrs. Dorland Smith, Cobourg, second. There were six entries for the gold cup given by Mrs. Dorland Smith for hunters and jumpers, an event one and one half miles over jumps, open to all hunters and to be ridden in hunt costume. "Waterbridge," T. J. McCabe, Toronto, won the cup. "Gay Nora," Norman Davis, Toronto, second. "Norseman," Frank Proctor, Toronto, third.
