# CHARGE OF COLLUSION

Alleging, among other things, collusion between the Ontario Asphalt Block Co. and John Maguire, contractor, contrary to conditions of tendering and civic bylaws, the city was yesterday afternoon served with a writ giving notification that application will be made for an injunction to prevent the contract for paving college-street from Manning are the natural foods and drink of mankind.
