## **HOOVER'S VIEWS BULLISH ON GRAIN**

Elated Longs Believe There is Reason to "Hope for the Worst."

Chicago, May 26.—Fresh advances in value of corn and oats took place to-day, largely as a result of statements by Herbert Hoover regarding the prospective Herbert Hoover regarding the prospective food situation. Corn closed strong. 2% to 4½ net higher: with July 169% to 169% and September 157% to 157% Oats gained 1% to 1½ to 3½ and provisions 10 to 70 cents.

Except May delivery, the corn market showed an upward trend from the outset. A ruling that because of the breakdown of railroad transportation no penalty would be exacted from defausters on May contracts here had a bearish effect at first as to that month. July and September deliveries, however, continued responsive to the persistent meagerness of, corn receipts here and to renewed export demand for wheat. Meanwhile widespread notice was being taken of Mr. Hoover's assertion that decrease in agricultural production might result in this country becoming dependent on overseas food supplies. Buying power breadened out and simultaneously offerings grew scarce. From middey on all months advanced sharply and the close was the top figures of the season.
