





**VIGILANTES OF THE SOUTH.**  
When the law and order fall, men take the powers of government into their own hands. Such was the case in the early days of the California gold fever, when the business men of "Flaco" organized the Vigilantes to put down the robbers and cut-throats preying on the community, and such was the case in the south in protecting life and property during the "Black Terror." Indeed, a clever writer has picturesquely styled these Ku Klux, "the Vigilantes of the south." Secrecy was the keystone of their success. The order was ruled from Memphis by a grand wizard of the invisible empire, the late General Nathan Bedford Forrest. It spread over most of the Southern States, overthrew the carpetbagger governments and restored peace, good order and security, tho' so little was known of it that a congressional investigation several years later failed to reveal any of its leaders or gain any insight into the principles, constitution or ritual of the order. members of the Klan were not known to their neighbors and friends. The "regulation" of any community was always entrusted to clansmen living remote from the scene. They rode into town masked and shrouded, on steeds similarly disguised, performed their labors silently and then disappeared into the night. Even the rumor of their coming caused the offending negroes to take to the timbers, and the fears of a wholesale insurrection and massacre of the white people quickly passed away. These, eccentrics but all-powerful night riders, which had so mighty an effect on the course of history, are accurately pictured in Thomas Dixon's famous play, "The Clansman," which local theatre-goers will see for the first time here at the Grand Opera House.
