Inquest Is Held Into Death of Little Leo Bennett

Witnesses Say Scott Northrup Did All He Could to Prevent Accident.

After deliberating 25 minutes the jury, composed of D. J. Stockford, foreman, Joseph Nixon, William V. Hatfield, William Crabbe, Arthur J. Nagle, Isaac Mercer and Charles E. Farren, empanelled to inquire into the death of Lee Bennett, three-year old con of Frank Bennett, Brunswick street, who died at the General Public Hospital at 6 o'clock Monday evening as a result of injuries sustained when struck by a coal truck, driven by Scott Northrup, an employe of R. P. & W. F. Starr, Limited, in Main

R. P. & W. F. Starr, Limited, in Main street Monday noon, returned a verdiot "attaching no blame to anyone." Coroner F. L. Kenney, M.D., presided at the inquest held in the police court last evening.

SEVEN WITNESSES.

Seven witnesses in all save their evidence at the inquest last evening, among them the father of the boy and the driver of the track. APPEARED SUDDENLY. Mr. Northrup said that the boy had suddenly run into the street from in front of a parked car and although he, Northrup, jammed the brakes and swerved the wheel hard to the left he was unable to escape striking the boy. The wheel which knocked the boy down also held him to the pavement although it came out at the inquest that it did not never over him. died. On seeing the condition of the youngster when admitted to the hospital, Dr. Knox said he called Dr. D. C. Malcolm immediately and the latter had an X-ray taken. The results of the X-ray showed the boy to be suffering from internal in-

juries in the region of the lungs as well as from numerous painful bruises.


