

# NO ONE BLAMED IN JURY VERDICT

Inquest Is Held Into Death of Little Leo Bennett

Witnesses Say Scott Northrup Did All He Could to Prevent Accident.

After deliberating 25 minutes the jury, composed of D. J. Stockford, foreman, Joseph Nixon, William V. Hatfield, William Grabbe, Arthur J. Nagle, Isaac Mercer and Charles E. Farren, empaneled to inquire into the death of Leo Bennett, three-year-old son of Frank Bennett, Brunswick street, who died at the General Public Hospital at 6 o'clock Monday evening as a result of injuries sustained when struck by a coal truck, driven by Scott Northrup, an employee of R. P. & W. F. Starr, Limited, in Main street Monday noon, returned a verdict "Attaching no blame to anyone." Coroner F. L. Kenney, M.D., presided at the inquest held in the police court last evening.

SEVEN WITNESSES. Seven witnesses in all gave their evidence at the inquest last evening, among them the father of the boy and the driver of the truck. Mr. Bennett said that he had often cautioned his children to stay away from Main street as he thought the traffic dangerous. Mr. Bennett said that this time his little son Leo had gone to a store in Main street to buy some candies.

Scott Northrup, driver of the truck, said that he had been driving trucks for the last eight years and had been operating the one which struck the boy, when that fall. He asserted that he had examined the brakes two weeks ago and they were in good working condition. This was emphasized during the inquest when almost all of the witnesses reported that the truck had stopped within a distance of four feet after striking the boy.

APPEARED SUDDENLY. Mr. Northrup said that the boy had suddenly run into the street from in front of a parked car and although he, Northrup, jammed the brakes and swerved the wheel hard to the left he was unable to escape striking the boy. The wheel which knocked the boy down also held him to the pavement although it came out at the inquest that it did not pass over him. Dr. Perry Knox, interne at the General Public Hospital, testified that he was present when the boy was admitted to the hospital last Monday noon and also when the boy died. On seeing the condition of the youngster when admitted to the hospital, Dr. Knox said he called Dr. C. C. Malcolm immediately and the latter had an X-ray taken. The results of the X-ray showed the boy to be suffering from internal injuries in the region of the lungs as well as from numerous painful bruises.

All the other witnesses testified to seeing the accident and to the commendable manner in which Northrup brought his heavily-laden truck to a stop.

The bridesmaid wore a gown of floral canton crepe and carried a bouquet of red roses. The officiant was numerous and very nice. The young people went on a motor trip through Nova Scotia and later will go to the Canadian West.

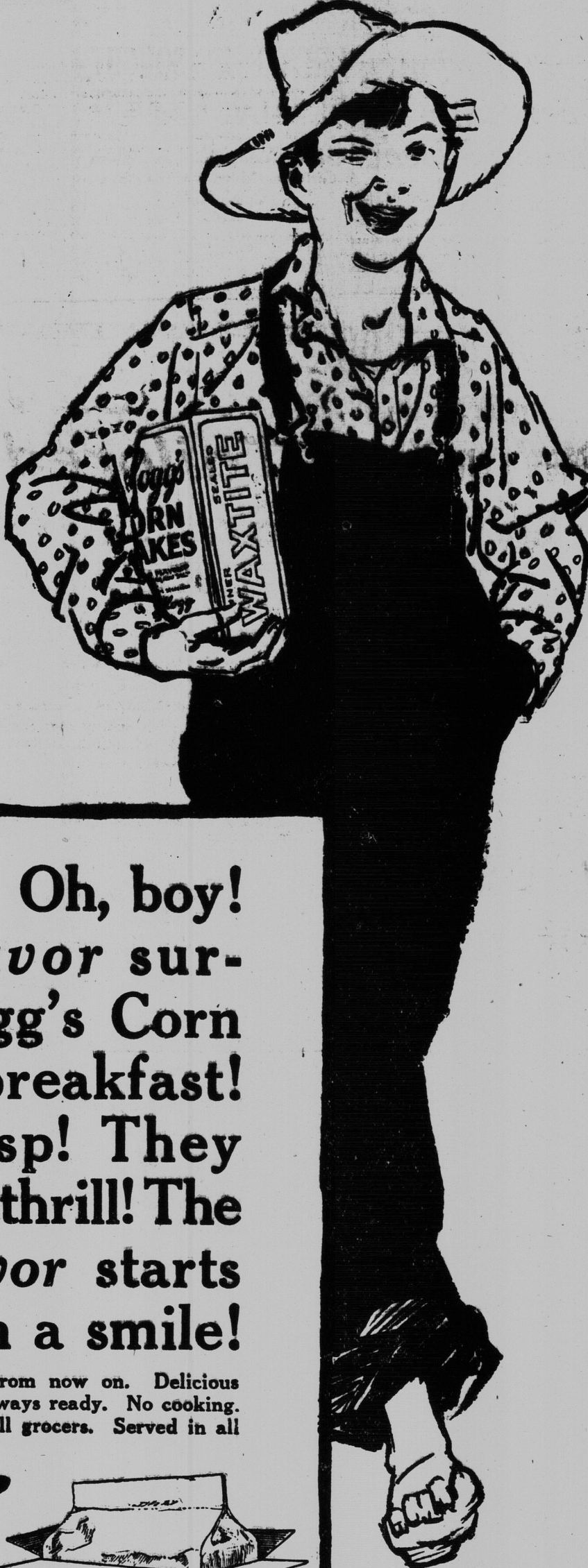

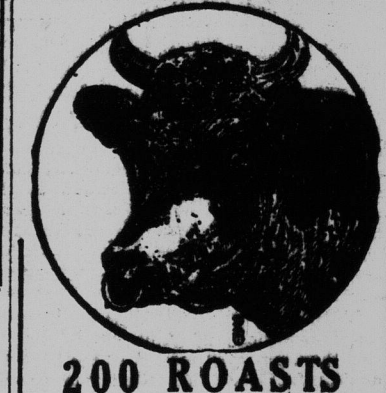

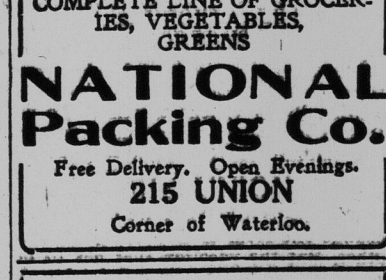
