

## ANNUNZIO, POPULAR HERO

Adorned With Flowers and  
Cheered Wildly at Anniversary  
Celebration—Hopes to  
Lead Soldiers to Rome.

Flume, Nov. 20.—(Associated Press  
correspondence.)—A striking demon-  
stration of the devotion of d'Annunzio's  
sops to their leader was given here  
the occasion of the celebration of the  
second anniversary of the victory of  
d'Annunzio's army in the war. The post "com-  
mander," as everyone calls d'Annunzio  
re, occupied a box in the Fenice  
theatre, where the celebration was held.  
His appearance was a signal for a  
series of ovations and cries of  
"Viva il Comandante."  
When two others had addressed the  
audience, who crowded the theatre, an-  
other blast of bugles made everyone  
rush to the box, where d'Annunzio stood  
in uniform of an Italian cavalry offi-  
cer. It would be a hopeless task to at-  
tempt to give a pale idea of the enthusi-  
asm of the crowd. Everyone rose to his  
feet, and the theatre resounded with the  
annunzian cry of "Eja, Eja, Alala,"  
in thousands of throats, while flowers  
and upon d'Annunzio from all sides.  
Eyes on Rome.  
Though his proclamations usually are  
written in a poetical and somewhat  
bombastic style, his speech consisted of  
simplest words. He declared that  
one alone really celebrated the Italian  
story, while Rome celebrated the as-  
sualtion of victory. He asked his  
sops to keep ready, as, sooner than was  
generally expected, he would take them  
to him to Rome. At these words the  
chusiasm was renewed, the people  
aved handkerchiefs, hats, sticks and  
spones in the air amid cries of, "To  
Rome, to Rome, Eja Eja, Alala, Rome,  
Rome," while the bombardment of flow-  
ers was redoubled.  
D'Annunzio's exit from the theatre  
as the occasion for fresh demonstra-  
ns of loyalty. His motorcar was sur-  
ounded by the crowd and obliged to  
ceed at a foot-pace while his men  
ight among themselves to approach  
d touch him. He was escorted all the  
y back to his residence by an admir-  
y multitude under a continuous fire
