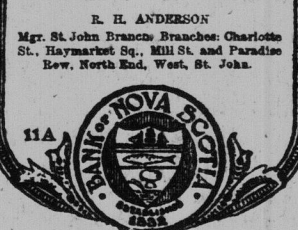

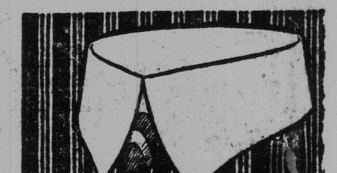
The report of the nominating committee was read by Mrs. A. R. McRoe and the officers nominated were all elected.
