The Nova-Scotia Baptist Association, met at Clements, June 23d and 24th, 1823, sendeth Christian salutation until corresponding Associations.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHRES,

THROUGH the distinguishing grace of our Heavenly Father, we are convened to deliberate on the affairs of the Redeemer's kingdom; which is an everlasting kingdom; which is est blished and prospered according to the immutable councils of Jehovah, and shall prosper until the stone cut out of the mountain shall become a great mountain, and fill the whole earth.

We rejoice that we have this precious season of mutual converse and taking sweet council together; to unite our feeble efforts to seek the peace and prosperity of Zion: our satisfaction is not a little increased by the continuation of the information they bring us: and we wish a continuation of the same.

It is generally a mourning time in our Zion, on account of backslidings and lukewarmness among professors, and abounding iniquity in the land: yet have we not been left without some drops of mercy, as you will see by our minutes. One of our Brethren of the New-Brunswick Association writes to his brother: "I expect to baptize twelve next Lard's Day; I have baptized more than two hundred since the work began, and it is the most solemn work I ever saw in my life."
