MADE RESIGNING EASY.

Uncle Ike's Real Reason For Giving Up Preaching. When Senator Mark Smith of Arizona was a boy he lived on a big plantation in Kentucky. It was in slave days, and one of his father's slaves, "Uncle Ike," who was the preacher for the place. Smith's father had built a small church on a corner of the plantation, and Uncle Ike held forth there every Sunday. This was pleasing to Ike because it not only gave him a chance to exhort the negroes, but it absolved him from any of the Sunday chores. One Sunday Mark went out by the barn and found Uncle Ike sitting disconsolately under a tree.



Halifax, N. S., Sept. 29.—Pastor Russell addressed a large Convention of Bible Students here. He received closest attention. We report one of the discourses from the text, "For by grace ye are saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God."—Eph. 2:8.

The speaker conceded that the subject of faith and its relation to salvation has been controversially confused in the minds of many for centuries. He held, however, that clearer views are now permeating Christian minds and hearts and that the conflict between salvation by faith and salvation by works is at an end. Both are now seen to be necessary. Works devoid of faith could not be perfect nor in any way acceptable to God. Faith without the works possible to it would not be a living faith but merely passive assent, which is not what God requires of those who would be footsteps followers of Jesus. The judgment of the Church determines for each member life or death eternal—and if life, what the degree of glory, honor, dignity and reward will be.

St. James points out that a faith which gives no manifestation to do good should be styled a dead faith and would be valueless in God's sight. He demonstrates his argument respecting the necessity of works by reminding us that although Abraham was justified by faith and not by works, nevertheless he was not justified without works but was required to demonstrate his faith by his works, even though his works were imperfect and could not of themselves have justified him.

Pastor Russell declared the present Age the Age of faith and the coming period of Messiah's Kingdom the Age of works. He cautioned his hearers, nevertheless, that in harmony with what he had already shown in the Scriptures that this would not mean that no works are now required nor that in the future Age no faith would be required. The standard of the next Age will be the standard of the present Age. The standard or test of the next Age will be works, not faith. The reason of this difference, he said, was manifested because of the close of the present Age. The entire race now could do perfect works now, and, if judged by works, all would be condemned fresh. Hence God now in saving man requires that he requires them to walk by faith and not by sight.

In the next Age, during Messiah's reign, he claimed that all the clouds and darkness, all the ignorance and superstition, would pass away before the rising Sun of Righteousness. As a result faith in the next Age will be a very simple matter. Knowledge will be so great that faith will take second place. Then good works will gradually become the test and standard of the next Age. The members of the different churches are requested to be present.

SAVED BY FAITH NOT NOW BY WORKS

It is Not of Yourselves; It is the Gift of God.

Pastor Russell Points Out That Present Age Is the Faith Age—Next Age Will Be the Age of Works—Address to a Large Convention of Bible Students.

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 29.—Pastor Russell addressed a large Convention of Bible Students here. He received closest attention. We report one of the discourses from the text, "For by grace ye are saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God."—Eph. 2:8.

The speaker conceded that the subject of faith and its relation to salvation has been controversially confused in the minds of many for centuries. He held, however, that clearer views are now permeating Christian minds and hearts and that the conflict between salvation by faith and salvation by works is at an end. Both are now seen to be necessary. Works devoid of faith could not be perfect nor in any way acceptable to God. Faith without the works possible to it would not be a living faith but merely passive assent, which is not what God requires of those who would be footsteps followers of Jesus.
