FIRST EDITION. A LONDON SUMMARY.

THE ENGLISH CHANNEL TUNNEL BILL REJECTED YESTERDAY.

The Revision of This Proposal Rejected—The Land Purchase Bill for Monday—Cannonry Waiting for England—Mrs. Langtry III.

By TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. LONDON, June 6.—In the common yesterday the bill for the construction of the tunnel under the English channel for a foot and a half was rejected by a vote of 234 to 153.

In the committee on the times bill a proposal for the equitable revision of the times in accordance with the altered conditions of industry was rejected after the amendment of clause 10 by a vote of 240 to 197.

In the Commons last night Mr. Goschen announced he would proceed with the land purchase bill on Monday.
