Toronto, June 5.—Lt. Col. Frank A. Fleming, eldest son of Sir Sandford Fleming, and a prominent officer of the Toronto garrison, died last night after a lingering illness. Lt. Colonel Fleming was former commandant of the Goyenror General's bodyguard and was a veteran of the Northwest Rebellion in 1885. Among the other military honors he held was a special medal given for officers attached to the contingent attending the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebration in 1897, and a long service medal. this vicinity today.
