## THE AMATEUR BASEBALL SITUATION

A number of those interested in amateur baseball met in the rooms of the St. John Athletic Club on Germain street last evening and after some discussion it was decided to organize a city league. It was shown that the Athletic Club had made arrangements for the Marathon grounds for evening baseball and were willing to enter a team in the league.

The Rockland A. A. team decided to enter and it was also stated that a team from the West End wished to enter. Although there was no representative from the North End it is almost a certainty that there will be a team representing that section of the city. It is also possible that a team from the South End will be entered.

Each team entering the league will be required to make an entrance fee of \$15 and each team will share in the gate receipts during the season.

The City League will have the grounds four evenings in the week, the other two evenings have been allotted to a church league.

The meeting was adjourned until Monday evening at 7:30 o'clock sharp, when it is thought that all the league details will be completed.

The bank clerks have organized a league in the city and arrangements were made for them yesterday to have the use of the Marathon grounds between the hours of five and seven o'clock in the evening.

With the Maritime City, East End, Bankers, West End and Church leagues St. John fans will have plenty of baseball this season.

This race is for speed boats, 40 feet and under, and will be run over the North Wharf and Beacon Buoys harbor course at 7 o'clock on the evening of July 17th.

The race promises to be more interesting than usual this year as owners of fast craft from neighboring clubs have signified their intention to have a try for the shield.

The holding of a long distance race to Fredericton this year was advocated but action was deferred to a later meeting.

The section expects to have a busy season as considerable interest in the plans for the different races is already being shown in boating circles.

## NOTABLES IN TURF CIRCLES

Louisville, Ky., May 8.—Many notables in turf circles of the United States are gathered in Louisville to witness the fortieth annual Kentucky derby at one mile and a quarter, which will be run tomorrow afternoon. Interest in this event this year appears greater than ever before owing to the fact that the purse is the largest in the history of the derby. Horsemen declare the entries comprise one of the most remarkable bands of three-year-olds ever brought together in a race in the country.

With \$10,000 added the purse this year will reach about \$13,500, or about \$50,000 to the winner.

Out of forty-seven eligibles there are ten horses which their owners have declared are certain to start, and two or three others which may go to the post. The favorite appears to be Old Rosebud, owned by H. C. Applegate, of Louisville, which will carry 114 pounds, and is quoted at about seven to five.
